

Sister Chan's Corner

An Unforgettable Experience by Sr. Mary Chan

1th February is an important day for the Church. On that day in 1858, Our Lady revealed herself to a young girl named Bernadette in Lourdes, a small town in southwestern France. Since then, Lourdes has become one of the world's most visited places of pilgrimage.

Before I came to work at our school, I was given the opportunity to go to Lourdes for a week. What a great joy for me when I heard the good news from my Provincial. I couldn't sleep that night, because I was too excited. I longed for the day to come and I learned as much about Lourdes as I could.

It is wonderful to spend time in Lourdes because many people come from all over the world to pray and deepen their faith. Some of them are sick or injured. They pray to the Blessed Virgin Mary and immerse themselves in the holy water in the grotto, in the hope that they will be cured.

Each day I got up early in the morning and attended Mass at the Grotto. There were always many people there. The priests took

turn to celebrate Mass in different languages, so that everyone might understand. One afternoon, I queued up and waited my turn to soak myself in the holy water. Before going into the water, I expressed my faith and said a special prayer.

Near the grotto there is an exhibition room, full of wheel chairs, walking frames, sticks and other equipment used by people with

disabilities. These items were left there to show that miracles had taken place and people were cured.

People visiting Lourdes have many different experiences. Some turn away from sin

because they have experienced God's love, while others receive grace from God and are cured. Some find peace again in their hearts. I always give thanks and praise to God for one of the most special experiences of my life.

interviewed a classmate and wrote a short piece about what they found out. We plan to include more interviews by students in future issues of the newsletter.











puzzles are always popular so we decided to put one on the back page of each newsletter. We're also teaching ECA students how to make a crossword puzzle. It's a fun thing to do!

Reader's Theatre



I really enjoyed the experience of that wonderful day.






famed Italian city of Ponky, and a genie who appears when you rub your nose. It also includes lots of very useful facts, many of which are untrue!





Following the read, our students thought about their own hopes and dreams, wrote them down and placed them inside the hopes and dreams box. We hope they come true for them!


